



Introduction

The high peaks of Snowdonia overlook the Llŷn Peninsula and the Irish Sea coast which is strewn with differing fishing locations, mountain granite rock mass plunging steeply into the sea giving deep water fishing marks close to shore. The area's 300km of coast is strewn with cosy sandy storm and pebble beaches, which are a magnet to the fish that inhabit them. The Menai Straits which divides the mainland from Anglesey is set in stunning scenery. The fishing here is mainly spring to late autumn with bass being the main quarry, best fished on a rising tide. Baits include crab, rag and lug, spinning is also effective. Dinas Dinlle itself is another venue well worth a visit as late spring early summer sees the arrival of the tope packs. These fish give tremendous sport to the anglers and can weigh from twenty pounds upwards. Availability is also present of outings on skippered crafts for conger, tope, ling, bull huss, whiting, the list is endless. When you look into the available opportunities and quality of the fishing, you need look no further for you have found the 'best' there is! 

- 1. Aberdesach beach Noted species: coalfish. whiting, flounder and dab Tide tips: low **Bait:** black lug, sandeel, mackerel, squid **Tips**: standard 5-6oz beach caster as long range casting may be needed – standard three hook flaper or two hook bomer rig.
- 2. Bennar beach, D6 Tal-v-bont **Noted species**: bass, plaice, flounder, codling Tide tips: low and high Bait: crab, mackerel, lugworm **Tips**: distance can be important even on low water.
- 3. Black Rock Sands, D5 Morfa Bychan Noted species: bass, flounder, mackerel **Tide tips**: high and low Bait: ragworm, crab **Tips:** standard 5-6oz beach caster. Try a one hook rig with size 3/0.
- 4. Conwy harbour F2 Noted species: bass, dab, flounder, plaice Tide tips: low Bait: crab, mussel, lug **Tips:** popular during bad weather as it is very sheltered.

5. Dinas Dinlle

Noted species: bass, codling. flounder, smoothound Tide tips: high and low **Bait:** black lug, squid, razorfish, crab, mussel **Tips**: true storm beach and

fishes very well over a westerly/south westerly wind.

- 6. Llanbedrog **C5** Noted species: bass, flounder, dogfish, bream Tide tips: low **Bait:** crab, mackerel, blow lug **Tips:** normal beach caster with 5oz weight and a three hook rig baited with a variety of baits.
- 7. Morfa beach, Trefor C4 Noted species: plaice, mackerel, pollock, wrasse, ray **Tide tips**: high Bait: crab, mackerel, blow lug **Tips**: standard 5-6oz beach caster with 20lb plus braking strain line. Try a one hook rig with size 2/0.

- 11. Pwllheli **C5** Noted species: dab. hus. bream, bass, mackerel, pollack, whiting, herring Tide tips: high and low Bait: mackerel, lugworm, crab **Tips**: try using feathers for hearing, mackerel or pollack. Standar beach caster is adequate.

Introduction

With more than a hundred lakes, all with their own distinctive character and a plethora of rivers the game fishing opportunities in the area are truly endless! South east of the largest natural lake in Wales the river Dee flows out of Bala Lake and through Gwynedd before entering into Denbighshire. 'Game fishing' can be experienced through seasonal salmon, brown trout and grayling. Alexander Sarakhanov (right) from Russia, took seven grayling in a four hour session, his first ever 'fly fishing' outing. 'Dolgadfa' can boast the best available river fishing watched over by soaring buzzards where the silence is seldom broken other than by the cry of the curlew, a sheep bleating, or a lone raven crowing. 

Fishing codes

Conservation code for anglers

Anglers are natural conservationists. Spending time by either lake, river or the sea instils an appreciation of the environment and most anglers develop commitment and respect for the wildlife and habitats around them.

This short introduction is intended to help you reduce any impact your angling activities may have on marine wildlife and the surrounding habitats and to inform those whose actions, usually through inexperience or carelessness, can endanger the marine or inland environment and the future of our fishing.

Access to land and fishing

Fishing from the coastal foreshore is a right enshrined in the Magna Carta. However, this right does not permit you to walk on private land to reach the foreshore without permission. If in doubt, keep to recognised rights of way. Access may also be limited in some areas – for instance on military sites. Most rivers and lakes are privately owned thus do seek permission from the owner and purchase a permit at all times.

- If driving to your venue, keep to established roads and tracks. Park sensibly, preferably in a recognised parking area.
- Do not block access points for landowners, farmers and emergency vehicles.
- Launching of boats should be from an approved location. (Please refer to boat launching on map).

Fishing in the vicinity of others

Try not to inconvenience or endanger other anglers. Remember, they probably have as much right to be there as you do!

Accidental loss of line and bait

Loss of tackle is caused mainly by snagging on a rocky seabed/river or on seaweed and weed.

Monofilament line persists in the environment and can continue to be a hazard to wildlife for many years. It is loss of line that present the greatest potential hazard to the environment.

Keeping your catch

One of the joys of angling is the opportunity to keep a portion of the catch for the table. Before killing the fish, first make sure it is above the minimum landing size.

Return all undersized fish alive. Please visit www.defra.gov.uk for further information on minimum size regulations.

Catch and release

In the interest of conserving stocks and maintaining biodiversity, anglers are encouraged to return all fish in a healthy condition. Many species survive after catch and release.

Whether you keep or return your catch, the welfare of the fish should be uppermost in your mind. The following pointers will help ensure your catch is returned.



Protecting the Environment

- Where possible and where safe to do so, release your fish while it is still in the water.
- If you have to bring the fish ashore or onboard to unhook it, try to use a net, (never gaff a fish you intend to release), handle the fish with wet hands and minimise the time the fish is kept out of the water. These measures will improve the chances of fish surviving on return.
- If you want to photograph or weigh your fish, handle firmly to prevent dropping or injury. A fish can injure itself struggling to escape, so hold firmly and have the camera or scales ready before starting to fish. Never hold a fish under the gill covers if it is to be returned.
- If you want to release all your fish, try using barbless or circle hooks. Barbless hooks may mean you lose a few more fish, but returning the fish you catch is easier for you and the fish. The correct use of a disgorger will also increase the chance of releasing a healthy fish.
- If you catch a tagged fish, send the complete tag and details of the species and length of the fish and location and time of capture to the local fisheries office.

Returning fish alive and healthy helps to sustain our sport!

Litter is an eyesore and costs local communities in clean-up operations and reduced amenity value. Plastic litter is particularly dangerous because it is strong and does not degrade, and items like sixpack rings, fishing line and carrier bags can entangle and choke wildlife.

- Reducing litter protects the environment, marine resources and local economies
- Be prepared take a bag with you especially for rubbish.
- Be responsible leave your venue cleaner than when you arrived
- Take litter home!
